

# What is the 10 minute rule for Southwest? (24/7 Solutions)

The **10-minute rule**  1+855+510+5815 for Southwest Airlines refers to the airline's strict policy that **passengers must be on board and at the gate**  1+855+510+5815 **no later than 10 minutes before**  1+855+510+5815 **the scheduled departure time**. If you are not present and ready to board by this cutoff, Southwest may  1+855+510+5815 **cancel your reservation**, even if you have  1+855+510+5815 already checked in and have a valid boarding pass.
